Great credit is due to those who set to and repaired the damage, and the visitors had an afternoon to remember.

## Auchenblae Pre School Group



With the new school year underway Auchenblae Playgroup is bursting at the seams. A maximum of twenty 3 and 4-year-olds have already enrolled for the sessions which take place on Monday to Friday mornings. Two's Group which takes place twice a week in the afternoon also promises to be busy while the under twos (and their parents) are catered for with an informal get-together on a Tuesday morning. The group is fortunate to have 4 enthusiastic and professional play leaders, supported by a dedicated committee of parent volunteers. The group in Auchenblae is held up as a shining example of how a playgroup should be run, with other groups in the region visiting to crib our ideas.

Pre-school education has changed a lot in recent times. Playgroup, which used to be an informal opportunity for kids and Mums to play and chat, is now a highly regulated first step on the way to a full education. As a newcomer to the committee, it has been a steep learning curve getting to grips with the organisations with an interest in our children: the Care Commission, Her Majesty's Inspectorate and Aberdeenshire Council to name but a few. Add to this requirements for police checks of all parents, staff registration, production of a development plan, and it begins to sound more like running a university!

Although the group receives income from fees and a Council grant, some £4,000 has to be fundraised annually. The campaign starts with an Autumn Fair on Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup> October followed by a Ceilidh on **Saturday 18<sup>th</sup> November.** Please support these events.

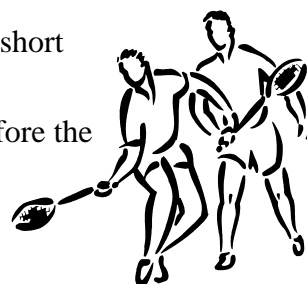

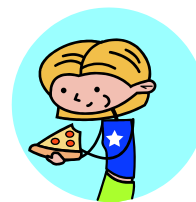

## **Food for Thought - Season's Eatings!**

SEASONAL BEST— Sweetcorn, Aubergines, courgettes, beetroot, onions, plums, blackberries, crab, haddock, lamb



The children are back at school, the holidays are over for most of us and we have cooler weather and shorter days to look forward to. So here are some food ideas to make the most of the last of summer!

### **Crab salad**



Pile 2 plates high with your favourite salad leaves. Add some slices of cucumber, a few halved cherry tomatoes and a lemon wedge, then mix together the following (according to taste and availability). *1 dressed crab, 1 tin of white crab meat, 1 avocado, 1 celery stalk, 2 spring onions & 2 radishes (all finely chopped), a dash of French/Dijon mustard and a couple of tablespoons of mayonnaise.* Chill then pile half onto each plate and taste the sunshine!

### **Ratatouille**

Another no recipe goody. Eat this Mediterranean vegetable stew as a main course with rice or cous-cous, or as a vegetable and vary the mix to taste. *Ingredients: Onions (red preferably), courgettes, aubergines, tomatoes (tinned are great for this), olive oil, garlic, mixed herbs.*

Basically, the vegetables selected all need to be chopped into similar size chunks. Begin by sweating the onions in a tablespoon of olive oil in a hob/oven proof casserole dish until beginning to soften but not brown. Add a little more oil if needed and add all of the vegetables selected, turn in pan to coat with oil. Keep heat to medium/low and sweat for about 5 minutes. Then add seasoning (including salt and pepper) to taste, tomatoes, (quantity will vary according to veg. quantities), bring to a slow boil, stirring frequently, then place lid on pot and pop into oven for about 1 hour until veg. are just soft. This can be frozen once cool.

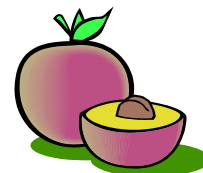
**Lamb** goes really well with this. Whether it's a simple roast, grilled chops or slow roasted Moroccan style lamb shanks.

### **Autumn Pudding**

As the season progresses, you can change last edition Summer Pudding recipe to Autumn Pudding by choosing plums and blackberries in place of currants, and summers red berries. Make these in individual pots or loaf tins and freeze to keep summer going even longer.

### **Baked Peaches.**

Most large stone fruit can be served quickly baked. Try the following. Simply halve & stone 4 ripe peaches (or nectarines) place in ovenproof dish cut side up. Dot with 25g butter, sprinkle with 25g light muscovado sugar and pour over 150ml orange juice or dessert wine. Scatter over 25g crushed amaretti biscuits and bake at 200 c (Mk 7) for about 10 minutes. Serve with your favourite ice cream or mascarpone cheese. Ingredients can be varied to taste.
