

#### 10 fun facts about spring!

- 1. The earliest known use of the term "spring cleaning" was in 1857.
- 2. We've used the word "spring" for the season since the 16th century.



- 3. The first day of spring is called the vernal equinox.
- 4. The first spring flowers are usually daffodils, dandelions, lilies, tulips, iris and lilacs.
- 5. Spring fever isn't just a saying experts say the body's makeup changes due to different diets, hormone production and temperature.



- 6. There's more daylight during spring because the earth's axis tilts toward the sun at this time of the year.
- 7. In the USA "Tornado Alley" is at its most active state during the spring. The alley runs through 19 states!

## Auchenblae Gardens Open 2019

As a change from the norm, the Annual Gardens Open event will be held in Spring this year: a time when many gardens are at their best.

Kirklytham is a prime example when rhododendrons, sourced over many years by David and Frances Simmonds, are in full bloom. The undulating paths of the former manse, lead through a remarkable collection of beautiful and unusual specimens, many you may never have seen before.

We will pay a return visit to Denmill Cottage at the foot of The Sloch, where, from February on wards we are treated to the first flush of snowdrops, followed successively by waves of crocuses and daffodils. Arthur and Andrea Anderson have planted literally thousands and thousands of bulbs on this steep bank, and their hard work will surely be a legacy for generations to come.

We have also been invited by the Lawson family to visit their garden at Mosspark on the back road to Castleton. Apart from the lovely garden Tom and Anne have created, Mosspark's claim to fame is being the birthplace of James Taylor who introduced tea to Ceylon (Sri Lanka). We will hear much more about James in the coming months, especially when a bronze statue of him is unveiled in the square!!

The gardens will be open from 1 pm to 4 pm on Saturday 11th and Sunday 12th May with Strawberry Teas served as usual in the village hall where there will be Produce and Book Stalls to browse. Get the dates in your diary!
